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What's Included & Not Included

Your Libya tour includes all **airport transfers**, hotel accommodation, permits, and a **Tuareg cultural experience** in Ghadames. Meals, Libya travel insurance, and the **East Libya military fee** are not included and must be paid separately.

Accommodation & Meals

Only breakfasts are included in the tour. Due to varied preferences and habits, other meals are not included. Travelers can expect to spend \$10–\$20 USD per meal. Our guide will always assist with restaurant recommendations and help tailor options to individual tastes.

m Tripoli & Coastal Antiquity

- **Tripoli City**: Includes Martyrs' Square, the Arch of Marcus Aurelius, the Red Castle (from the outside), the Old Town, Gurgi Mosque, the traditional Saraya and Bab Al-Menshia markets, and Tripoli Corniche & Algiers Square. The city blends Roman, Ottoman, and Italian architecture.
- **Leptis Magna**: One of the most spectacular Roman cities in the world, with a massive forum, basilica, theatre, and preserved mosaics.
- **Sabratha**: A beautifully preserved coastal Roman city featuring a grand theatre and temples overlooking the Mediterranean.

- Qasr al-Hajj & Kabaw Qasr: Fortified granaries built by Amazigh (Berber) communities to store grain and goods, with stunning views of the mountain landscape.
- Bu Gheilan Troglodyte Houses: Unique underground dwellings used for climate protection and community life.

- Ghadames Old City Tour: Explore narrow alleyways and traditional mudbrick homes in this UNESCO World Heritage site.
- **Desert Safari to Ras Al-Ghoul**: Sunset sand dune exploration and a Touareg fire camp experience.

Ubari Desert & Saharan Culture

- **Ubari Lakes Region**: Visit oases like Gaberoun and Mandara, famous for their surreal beauty. **Wadi Mathendous**: A prehistoric valley featuring ancient petroglyphs carved into canyon walls.
- **Germa City**: Capital of the ancient Garamantian civilization, showcasing desert architecture and archaeological remains.

- Susah (Apollonia): The port city of ancient Cyrene, with extensive ruins facing the sea.
- Cyrene: The jewel of Eastern Libya, featuring Greek temples, the agora, theatre, and necropolis.
- Ras Al Hilal & Al-Athrun: Dramatic coastal cliffs hiding Byzantine churches carved into the rock.
- Qasr Libya Museum: Houses beautiful mosaics from the West and East Churches.
- Tolmeita (Ptolemais): Another key site of the Pentapolis with impressive Roman ruins.
- Benghazi: Often used as a transit point; access may depend on current logistics and air connectivity.

Important: All itineraries are subject to change due to real-time conditions such as security updates, weather events, or travel restrictions from Libyan authorities. RJ Travel operates only **government-approved Libya excursions** and will adjust your program as needed to ensure safety and legal compliance. All travelers must follow the guidance of their assigned Libya tour guide and the accompanying **official police escort**.

Step-by-step Booking Process

All Libya tours must be **booked in advance** due to required permits, visa processing, and security coordination. To ensure availability and smooth planning, we recommend beginning your **Libya travel booking process** at least **1.5 to 2 months before your intended travel date**.

- 1. Choose your itinerary and check flight availability (do not purchase flights yet).
- 2. RJ Travel checks service availability and whether a military escort is required for any price update.
- 3. Client fills up the Visa Invitation Letter form.
- 4. Client signs the trip agreement and booking conditions.
- 5. The client pays a deposit to confirm the reservation.
- 6. RJ Travel and local partners provide the Letter of Invitation (LOI) after 1 to 4 days.
- 7. Client applies for the Libyan e-visa online.
 - a. Cost: \$63 USD
 - b. Processing time: approximately 10 days
 - c. Visa fees are non-refundable as they are processed by the government
- 8. After visa approval:
 - a. Client sends travel insurance and flight ticket
 - b. If visiting East Libya, the client transfers the \$500 USD military fee to our designated local provider.
- 9. RJ Travel arranges final logistics, including permits, domestic flights, and escort coordination.
- 10. The remaining balance is paid on arrival in Libya, or by bank transfer to our designated local provider bank account.

Arrival at Tripoli Airport

When arriving at **Tripoli International Airport**, foreign tourists must follow the **non-Libyan passport control line**, which can take up to 2 hours depending on the day. After passing immigration and **customs check**, you'll meet your **RJ Travel guide and Tourist Police escort** at the arrival gate.

Upon arrival in Tripoli:

- You will board a shuttle bus from the plane to the terminal.
- At immigration, follow the "Non-Libyans" passport control line (left side).
- Waiting times can range from 40 minutes to 2 hours, depending on traffic.
- Remain calm and respectful throughout the process, even in case of delays.
- Presenting a color printout of your visa and passport often helps accelerate immigration.
- Our guide and assigned police escort will be waiting for you after the visa window.

Entering Libya: Visa, LOI & Permits

All travelers need a valid **Libya eVisa**, obtained through the official **eVisa portal**, and a **Letter of Invitation (LOI)** from an authorized operator. Those visiting **East Libya** must also secure **military clearance**, which involves a separate \$500 fee sent to local authorities.

East Libya: Military Fee & Logistics

To enter East Libya, travelers must pay a \$500 USD Military Entry Fee imposed by the Military Investment Authority of the Libyan National Army, which is required for issuing internal travel permits and clearances. This fee must be paid after visa approval via bank transfer to our approved local partner and is non-refundable, as it is sent directly to the authorities.

Libya is safe for travel only with approved **permits** and an official **Tourist Police escort**, as required by national regulations. For trips to cities like **Benghazi** and **Cyrene**, travelers may need to be accompanied by armed escorts in coordination with the **Military Investment Authority**.

Please note that this mandatory fee is subject to change, increase, reduction, or annulment at any time — including last-minute — without prior notice or consultation with RJ Travel or the client, as it is determined solely by the Libyan military.

Safety, Tourist Police & Military Zones

Libya remains a post-conflict country. Even with approved permits, local authorities may restrict access to areas without prior notice. We must follow security and military instructions at all times. Flexibility and understanding are essential while traveling in Libya. All travel in Libya is supervised by the Tourist Police. Permits are issued by local authorities, and RJ Travel and its partners are legally responsible for all travelers under their care.

Some nationalities require an additional armed police escort in addition to the standard Tourist Police. This may increase the overall tour cost, and a separate quotation will be provided, typically within 1 to 3 business days.

This applies to citizens of: USA, UK, Canada, Australia, Germany, France, Russia, and China.

If any of these nationalities are present in the group, RJ Travel must provide a government-assigned armed escort and cover their accommodation, meals, and transportation. This requirement will influence the final price of the tour, which can only be confirmed upon official request to local authorities. The cost will depend on availability, the number of travelers, and other logistics. These escorts operate discreetly in separate vehicles and are trained to maintain a low profile throughout the trip.

Packing, Money Tips & Connectivity

Tourists should pack conservatively and bring clean **USD banknotes** for expenses, as **currency exchange** is limited and **Libya ATMs** may not work. For connectivity, a **Libyana SIM card** can be bought at Tripoli Airport, but **Wi-Fi in Libya hotels** is often slow or unstable.

To ensure a smooth and respectful travel experience, it's essential to pack with intention when visiting Libya — especially if your tour includes the desert regions such as **Ghadames**, the **Ubari Lakes**, or the **Acacus Mountains**. Below are our recommendations for what to bring, how to manage money, and how to stay connected during your **Libya travel** adventure.

Clothing & Personal Items

Modest clothing: Lightweight, breathable, and conservative. Long-sleeved shirts and full-length pants are ideal. For women, a scarf is useful in rural or religious areas.

Desert protection: A wide-brim hat, sunglasses, and a scarf or **shemagh** to cover your face during windy or sandy conditions.

Footwear: Durable walking shoes or hiking sandals for archaeological sites and desert terrain. Avoid open-toe sandals during treks.

Daypack: Bring a lightweight backpack to carry essentials on day trips: water bottle, snacks, sunscreen, hand sanitizer, lip balm, tissues, and a flashlight.

Health & hygiene: Personal medicine, mosquito repellent, wet wipes, and a small towel. In the desert, showers are limited, so quick-wash solutions are helpful.

Currency & Money Handling

Bring USD cash: Clean, crisp \$50 or \$100 bills printed after 2009. These are easiest to exchange in Libya.

Exchange carefully: Currency exchange is possible in Tripoli or with your guide's assistance. **Libya ATMs** rarely work for foreign cards, and credit cards are not accepted.

Keep a hidden pouch: Store your money in multiple spots (e.g., a money belt and small day bag) for safety.

Connectivity & Power

SIM card: Buy a local **Libyana or Almadar SIM card** at the Tripoli Airport. Most plans are affordable and include 4G coverage in cities.

Wi-Fi: Available in many hotels but often slow or unreliable. Don't rely on Wi-Fi for uploads, especially in Ghadames or desert regions.

Power: Libya uses 220V European plugs (type C and F). Bring a universal adapter and a power bank — especially useful during long drives or overnight desert stays.

We also recommend downloading offline maps, translating essential phrases into Arabic, and bringing a small journal if you want to record your experience. A full **Libya packing checklist** is available upon request after booking — just ask your RJ Travel representative.

Cultural Etiquette & What Not to Do

Libya is a conservative Islamic country where **public photography**, especially of **women or checkpoints**, is restricted. Visitors should avoid discussing politics or religion, dress modestly, and respect **Libyan customs** such as refusing to shake hands with the opposite gender.

Travel Insurance Requirements

Travel insurance is **mandatory**. For destinations classified as Level 3 ("Reconsider Travel") or Level 4 ("Do Not Travel") by the US State Department, your insurance must explicitly state that it **covers travel to Libya**.

Your policy must include:

Medical expenses and hospitalization Emergency medical evacuation Trip cancellation or interruption Baggage loss or delay Repatriation of remains

Refunds, Insurance & Visa Denial Policy

At RJ Travel, we aim to provide fair and transparent terms for all Libya travel packages, while respecting legal requirements set by Libyan authorities. Below you'll find our updated cancellation, refund, and insurance policy — applicable to both private and Libya group tours.

Visa Denial: If your **Libya visa** is denied, RJ Travel retains **\$200 USD** to cover the Letter of Invitation (LOI) and administrative processing. The remaining deposit is refunded.

Letter of Invitation (LOI): The LOI is valued at \$200 USD and is **non-refundable** once issued, even if your visa is denied. **East Libya Military Fee:** This fee is paid directly to Libyan military authorities and is **non-refundable** under any circumstance.

Travel Insurance: All travelers are required to provide valid **travel insurance covering Libya** (a Level 3 or 4 advisory country). We recommend purchasing insurance that includes trip interruption, evacuation, and medical coverage. **General Cancellation:** Unused tour balance not yet paid is subject to <u>our cancellation terms</u>.

WARNING: Any unauthorized use of the LOI, including attempting to enter Libya without our coordination, will lead to service cancellation and reporting to local authorities. This could result in detention at immigration upon arrival.
